

Nursery News April/May 2018

I hope everyone has had an enjoyable Easter and that your children are excited about their third term at nursery.

Nursery Themes This Month

As already outlined our April topic will aim to develop the children's interest and knowledge in People Who Help Us and in May we will begin to explore minibeasts/summer in the garden.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development focus

- We are encouraging the children to persevere with a task and take pleasure in their achievements.
- The children are also being encouraged to engage and work cooperatively with each other towards an end goal.
- Our children will be encouraged to expand their social circle, welcoming other children to engage in an activity of mutual interest.
- Developing independence continues to be a focus which includes pouring their own drink for snack, putting on coats/shoes/wellingtons, zipping coats, etc.
- Please help your child to be independent and fully ready for P1 by:-
 - 1. Encouraging them to put on their own clothes at home
 - 2. Attend to themselves at the toilet
 - 3. Put on/take off their coats
 - 4. Bringing wellingtons to school and shoes they can manage (eg. Velcro closing!!)
 - 5. Hanging up coats, bags, clothes etc.

Physical Development focus

- We are encouraging the children to move with increasing confidence, control and co-ordination. Our Super Hero day obstacle course will be one way of further developing these skills!
- We will continue to provide a range of activities to challenge and extend the children's fine motor skills and develop hand/eye coordination.
- We will be encouraging them and guiding them with their pencil grip through a range of fun activities.

Early Mathematical Experiences

- We are continuing to encourage the children to rote count to ten and touch count objects during their play. For example, counting how many beads/bricks they have used; playing dice games and engaging in number rhymes, such as '5 little speckled frogs'.
- This month there will be a focus on length where children will be encouraged to use the words 'long' and 'short' when comparing two objects.
- Our shape focus is rectangle, for example, a fire engine, our paper for drawing on, the container we planted our runner beans in etc.

The World Around Us

 The children thoroughly enjoyed planting runner beans and potatoes, especially when one bag of compost was called 'Jack's Magic'!! Now they regularly observe and talk about the growth of the stems and leaves. In the coming weeks we will be planting lettuce, radishes, rocket, spinach and sunflowers.

 This month we will be encouraging the children to hold hands with a grown up when walking out from nursery to their car as part of Road Safety and People Who Help Us. They will also be hearing about the lollipop lady/man, firefighters, nurse, doctor, dentist, etc.
