#### **Labelled Uniform**

Well done to everyone who is looking immaculate and wearing their uniform with pride. Please ensure <u>all</u> of your child's uniform and his/her coat are clearly labelled with his/ her name and please remember to bring in a change of clothes for your child to leave in school. Also, please make sure your child brings a coat to school every day.

Bags with a **full change** should be left in school and will remain here. In line with the Covid-19 guidance, we wish to minimise the need for objects to be transported between home and school. Adults are unable to access the cloakroom so additional items should not be left here. We have placed a box outside our front doors for your convenience, especially when transferring belongings to child care or other family members collecting your child.

#### **Car Parking**

Please take care when parking near the nursery gates and show consideration to local residents. Please do not obstruct residents' driveways. Due to health and safety issues, cars are NOT permitted within the staff car park at any time (even to turn). The school gates may be open at times during the day, but this is for disabled access only. Those needing to park inside the gates for this reason must speak to the Principal beforehand. Please ensure everyone who is picking up your child is aware of these arrangements and thank you for your cooperation in this matter.



#### **European Languages Day**

In Nursery we like to celebrate where everyone comes from and the languages that we all can speak. On **Monday 26th September** we are celebrating European Languages Day. We will be learning about other countries and how to say 'hello' in other languages.

#### At home:

- •You could look at a map and talk about some of the countries you might have heard of.
- •Learn how to say hello in another language.
- •Talk about your favourite food and what country it comes from.

If you would like to **DRESS UP** in a language day theme - a Spanish matador / senorita, an Italian pizza chef or a French man in a stripy top, beret with a loaf of bread! Choose any country you like! (You can even be an international footballer for the day!!) Or just be creative and make something yourself!!

#### **Special Books**

The special photograph book you have made with your child has been a great success. Thank you all so much for the enormous effort you have put in to making them. They will enable us to get to know your child a little better and serve as a valuable talking point and 'settling in' tool.

#### Nursery Theme for September

Our main themes over these two months are 'Making Friends' and 'Nursery Rhymes'.

Children of all ages enjoy listening to and being involved in rhyme. The repetitive language and rhythms of these rhymes provide a solid basis for encouraging early literacy skills. Do get involved and enjoy talking to your child about the rhymes they learn in the nursery and about your own favourite nursery rhymes - don't forget to ask your child to show you the actions to our rhymes and songs!



#### **Key Learning**

**Personal, Social and Emotional Development -** We are focusing on settling into nursery which includes: - getting to know our teacher and classroom assistants; becoming familiar with our Sunshine Rules; beginning to develop self-help skills.

**Physical Development** - We are focusing on safely navigating our way around our environment, both indoors and outdoors. We are learning where to find our resources and how to travel safely. We are also learning how to climb/pedal/slide showing an awareness of others. We are remembering to use our safe walking feet inside.

**Language Development -** We are focusing on attention and listening development. The children are learning to sit attentively and listen to a short story and to others speaking.

Our listening rules are - good sitting, quiet lips, looking eyes, listening ears, quiet hand to speak.

#### Pick Up and Drop Offs

Dogs should not be brought onto school grounds during pick up and drop offs (Even if it is on a lead).
